The Centers for Disease Control estimates that 4 out of 5 Heroin users started by using opioid medications that were not prescribed for them. Every year, the US Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), along with its national, tribal and local community partners sponsor two events called National Prescription Drug Takeback Day.

## Saturday, **April 26, 2025**

The goal of these events is to provide safe, convenient and responsible means of prescription drug disposal.

The April 2024 event brought in 630,000 pounds (315 tons) nationwide of medication, according to the DEA.gov website.
